#### **Biographical/Historical Note**

James Boardman Cable (1846-1915) was born in New Orleans, La. and served in a Confederate hospital during the Civil War. Like his brother, George Washington Cable, James was a writer, producing mostly poetry and short stories. He resided in Long Beach, Mississippi with his wife Julia A. Cable.

#### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection chiefly consists of Cable's correspondence and published and unpublished literary manuscripts. These items reflect his personal relationship with his brother, his own literary career, and his service in a Confederate hospital. Letters (1865-1866) from Cable to his mother mention his work as an orderly at Oliver Hospital, Lauderdale, Mississippi, during the Civil War. Letters from George indicate his indifference and aversion to seeing James. Some genealogical material regarding the Cable family and an article about James B. Cable are included, as well as a number of his poems (1897-1910) and stories (undated). The printed item is a first edition (1880) of George Cable's "The Grandissimes."
