## **BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE**

Related families of Union and Lincoln Parishes in Louisiana.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

The collection of papers pertains to the Baughman and related families of Union and Lincoln Parishes in Louisiana. The collection includes letters from Ireland and Canada recommending Thomas Goodman as a dancing instructor (1834-1845); enlargement prints of sheet music of antebellum and Civil War waltzes and marches (1848-1892); theater programs and playbills; and issues of periodicals such as *Time* and *Collier's* (1944-1945). Issues of Louisiana newspapers contain obituaries of family members; views of the Louisiana Polytechnic Institute campus at Ruston (1933); the history and celebration of the hundredth anniversary of Farmerville and Union Parish (1939); articles concerning the death of Franklin D. Roosevelt and the Japanese surrender in World War II (1945); and a description of havoc caused by Hurricane Audrey in Cameron Parish and along the coast of the Gulf of Mexico (1957). Also included [on microfilm only] are *The (Mount Sterling) Kentucky Sentinel* (January 9, 1868) and *The Clarksville (Missouri) Sentinel* (Feb. 19, 1885), containing an article on New Orleans Mardi Gras.

The collection also contains a cashbook (1885-1908) bearing the names of Mrs. M. Faust and Christina Faust, with entries for income received from [New Orleans] real estate and expenditures, and a scrapbook (ca. 1928) of pictures of popular film stars including Mary Pickford, Marguerite Clark, Theda Bara, Pearl White and others.
