BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Sylvester L. Cary was an emigration agent for the Southern Pacific Railroad Company, a founder of Jennings, Louisiana, and "father" of the southwestern Louisiana rice industry. Cary actively solicited Iowa farmers to immigrate to southwestern Louisiana.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Scrapbook consists largely of newspaper clippings concerning Cary genealogy, rice and fruit tree cultivation, the settlement and development of Jennings and southwestern Louisiana, Holstein cattle, farming associations and fairs, national financial issues, the Southern Pacific Railroad Company, and Sylvester L. Cary. The clippings are pasted over the 1864 accounts of a general store in Iowa, La.
