BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Journalist and organizer of Southern women's literary clubs of Holly Springs, Marshall County, Mississippi. She created the "Mr. Punch" column in the *Times-Democrat* (New Orleans) and was a regular contributor to other literary periodicals.

Hamilton F. Richardson, a Baton Rouge tennis player, is also represented in the collection. He toured Japan in the 1950s.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Early correspondence includes a letter from J. L. Pulliaus (1866) to Cora Watson regarding the disposition and compensation for former slaves, two letters from Henry Wadsworth Longfellow (May 17 and September 20, 1874), a sketch of George Washington Cable (initialed by him), and a note from Frances Willard, President of the Woman's National Christian Temperance Union (1881). Later correspondence pertains to Mississippi and Louisiana women's clubs, with several letters from Elizabeth Lyle Saxon. Miscellaneous items include the *Official Programme of the Return of the C.I.V.* (undated), a British military branch, and a scrapbook of Cora E. Carey and genealogical information on the Carey, Moore and Johnson families.

Correspondence from D. Minor Mickle, a resident of China, describes Chinese customs and way of life. Accompanying these letters are photographs of various scenes in Hunan Province and city of Canton, including photographs depicting Chinese punishment by torture.

Correspondence and a scrapbook pertain to Hamilton F. Richardson's visit to Japan in 1951. Letters to his parents describe casualties from the Korean War and customs and travel.
