#### **BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE**

Family of planters and slaveholders near Charleston, South Carolina, and later Eunice, Louisiana.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Collection consists of correspondence, legal and business papers, printed items, and photographs concerning the Dewees and related Postell, Gadsden, Lyman, and Colcock families. Pre-Civil War and Reconstruction materials contain land and slave sale documents, tax receipts, stocks and bonds, court decisions, wills, deeds, estate settlements, marriage certificates, and property settlements.

Photographs include two manuscript volumes: one a photograph album and the other a memory book with photographs and newspaper clippings. There are 185 loose photographs. Some individuals in photographs are identified, and most are portraits of family members (1851-ca. 1920). Printed items include religious items and ephemera.

#### **SERIES DESCRIPTIONS**

#### Series I. Correspondence, 1817-1959, undated

One of the earliest letters in the collection, written to John DeWees from Jane D. Wright in South Carolina, discusses relations with slaves (September 8, 1859). Also included is a letter pertaining to the tax assessment of a slave (April 19, 1860), and two letters mentioning poor economic conditions in Louisiana and South Carolina (1866, 1869). Joseph DeWees writes to the Second Presbyterian Church in Charleston explaining his reasons for declining higher church office (February 20, 1876). Memorials of Joseph DeWees from Holy Trinity Church (May 15, 1883) are also included, as well as a number of children's letters (1908-1909) and letters pertaining to genealogy (1860-1959).

#### Series II. Business and Legal Papers, 1785-1908, undated

Business and legal papers consist of bills, promissory notes, accounts, receipts, and a number of documents pertaining to slaves. These include a paper outlining the division of real estate and slaves among family members (January 1827), a note of sale price and commission for a slave named Lucy, a washer and ironer (December 1838), and documents relating to a marriage settlement of real estate and slaves in Charleston (May 1843). Also included is a petition of an estate administrator to sell a slave and her four children at public auction (September 7, 1843), a bill of sale for slaves from the estate of John Harleston (January 24, 1850), the will of Sarah Postell of Charleston bequeathing slaves and other property (May 15, 1851), the mortgage of nine slaves between James Copes and John DeWees (1873), and bills of sale for slaves (1852, 1859).

Other legal papers include a bond between Charles G. Branford and the German Friendly Society of Charleston (March 20, 1857) and a statement of account on the bond (February 1, 1860). Legal papers pertaining to the estate of John DeWees are included as well as the wills of Jane Gadsden (February 19, 1877), Elizabeth DeWees (1880), Joseph DeWees (April 16, 1883), Hannah Eason (December 10, 1902), and William DeWees (December 12, 1902). A number of property sales in New Orleans are also included (1887-1901) as well as mortgages and conveyances of land and buildings in South Carolina (1785, 1832-1852) and a deed of partition of land among the DeWees family (July 25, 1881). Tax receipts from St. Philip's and St. Michael's Parishes in South Carolina (1864-1894) as well as from the city and county of Charleston and the state of South Carolina (1895-1907) are also found in the collection.

Finally, two volumes include a measurement notebook (July 22, 1846-June 17, 1860, undated) containing mathematical rules and equations, and lists of various measurements, and an account notebook (January-February, 1868).

#### Series III. Printed items, 1852-1954, undated

Printed items include frontispieces to the *Book of Common Prayer* (1846) and the *Hymnal According to the Use of the Protestant Episcopal Church* (1887), prayer cards (1879-1954), a booklet from the Americanization Department of the Veterans of Foreign Wars entitled *Woodrow Wilson, Franklin K. Lane, Theodore Roosevelt on Americanism* (undated), as well as programs for commencement at Eunice High School (undated) and Rice Institute in Houston, Texas (1937).

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Newspaper clippings pertain to Eunice High School, LSU athlete Dana Jenkins, and local church and family news (1883-1946).

#### Series IV. Photographs, 1851-1920, undated

Also included are 185 photographs of street scenes, fields, and homes in South Carolina and Louisiana, as well as many portraits of family members and unidentified persons (1861-1915, undated) in addition to two manuscript volumes. Volumes include a Reta White photograph album, Eunice, La., (1912-1916, undated) containing photographs of Eunice High School, students, sporting events, social activities, and a photograph portraying the aftermath of a storm (p. 46) as well as a Lois Dwight Lyman Memory Book, Eunice, La., (1914-1919, undated) containing photographs of Eunice High School faculty and students, sporting events such as the Lafayette Rally, graduation dresses, LSU campus, War Relics Train, men in military uniforms, as well as ribbons, report cards, programs, tickets, newspaper clippings, and dance cards.
