BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

In the early 1850s, Henry Watkins Allen, a Virginia attorney, established the Allendale sugar plantation in West Baton Rouge Parish, Louisiana. Allen served as a general in the Confederate Army during the Civil War, and he served as the 17th governor of Louisiana late in the Civil War. After the war, he fled to Mexico where he died in 1866. For the next sixteen years, Allendale Plantation changed hands several times, until John and Martin James Kahao purchased the plantation in 1882. The Kahao family successfully operated the sugar plantation and mill for several decades. During the second half of the twentieth century, Allendale Plantation transitioned from hand labor and mule cultivation to mechanized farming.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Collection is comprised of business papers and photographs. Business papers include minutes of board and stockholders meetings, financial papers, correspondence, legal documents, and account books relating to the operation of Allendale Plantation. Account books contain information on laborers, wages, and crop production. Papers also include brief histories of Allendale Plantation and of its owners, the Kahao family. Photographs are comprised of seventy 5 x 7 copy prints of photographs found in the Kahao family scrapbook (retained by owner) that include family photographs, scenes of Allendale Plantation buildings, workers, and sugar cane fields.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

Series I. Business Papers and Record Books, 1920-1970, 1996, undated.

Business papers contain the minutes of Board of Directors meetings and stockholders meetings (1960-1970), certificate and articles of incorporation for Allendale Plantation, Inc. (June 1960), notice of registered agents (June 17, 1960), and correspondence. Correspondence between Martin J. Kahao and the Kern County Land Company relates to compensation for damage to land (1966-1967). Also found in this group are financial papers, tax records, lease and sale agreements, and powers of attorney.

Twelve record books are also part of this series. They include a sugar cane record book, v.1 (1955-1965), a record book of crop and field maintenance and field work, v. 2 (1934-1960), two ledgers with index containing invoices for plantation and personal expenditures. v. 3-4 (1955-1957), and ledgers showing plantation expenses, inventories, account balances, laborers wages and cane crop production v. 5, 8-9, 11-12 (1920-1969). Ledgers are indexed. Additional record books include a journal, v. 10 (1953-1957), a crop record book, v. 6 (1938-1960), and a volume containing cashbook entries and journal entries, v. 7 (1920-1942).

A history of Allendale Plantation (1996) and a history of the Kahao family (1996) are also present.

Series II. Photographs, ca. 1900-ca. 1930s

Photographs are comprised of seventy 5 x 7 copy prints of photographs found in the Kahao family scrapbook (original scrapbook retained by owner). Photographs depict family members, Allendale Plantation house, plantation store, African American tenant farmers and servants, plantation buildings, sugarcane fields, the Mississippi River, and its levee.
