Summary This collection of photographs and textual materials documents the lives

of Michael J. and Mary Anne Hynes Frenzel, including childhood, marriage, travels, family events, and community and social activities. Additional material provides a family history of the allied Frenzel, Jeanfreau and Dielenschneider families of Louisiana. The collection also illustrates Michael J. Frenzel's twenty-year military career as an

officer and pilot in the United States Air Force.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Michael Joseph Frenzel was born in Baton Rouge, La., in 1942, to Earl E. and Renée Jeanfreau Frenzel. He attended St. Joseph Academy and St. Agnes School for his elementary education and graduated from Catholic High School in 1960. He enrolled at Louisiana State University, where he participated in the ROTC program. After graduating in 1965, he entered the United States Air Force and the pilot training program at Laredo Air Force Base in Laredo, Tex. He remained on active duty until his retirement in 1985.

Mary Anne Hynes, born December 10, 1943, was the daughter of James "Jimmy Daddy" Hynes and Elizabeth Gebelin Hynes. As a child, she attended St. Agnes, Academy of the Sacred Heart schools and graduated from St. Joseph Academy, Baton Rouge, in 1961. After high school, she obtained a bachelor degree in education from Louisiana State University (1961-1965), and Master of Arts in Early Childhood Development from George Peabody College, Nashville, Tenn. (1965-1966). After her graduation from Peabody in 1966, she and Michael married on July 16, 1966, at Christ the King Chapel on the LSU campus in Baton Rouge. Together they had three children: Elizabeth Renée (b. 1968), Patrick Joseph (b. 1969), and Michael Sean (b. 1969). Both Michael and Mary Anne were active in the local Baton Rouge community and in the Catholic community, particularly St. Joseph Cathedral. Note: For additional genealogical information, see the Gebelin-Walsh-Hynes-Frenzel Family Papers.

Michael Frenzel's family of origin is also represented in the papers. His father, Earl Edmond Frenzel, was born November 3, 1910, the son of Edmund Merrill and Donatile Dooley Frenzel. As a youth, he attended St. Peter's College, New Iberia, La., graduating on June 12, 1928. After graduation, he received a scholarship to attended Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering in 1932, and a Master of Science in 1934. He began his professional career at Freeport Sulphur Company, Happy Jack, La., in June 1934. He was later offered a position with Standard Oil of Louisiana, at the Baton Rouge refinery, which he accepted on May 12, 1936. He retired from Exxon, a successor of Standard Oil, on November 1, 1975, after nearly forty years.

Earl Frenzel married Renée Jeanne Jeanfreau, daughter of Alvey Joseph and Honorine Dielenschneider Jeanfreau, on June 16, 1935, in Destrehan, Louisiana. She was born January 14, 1912, in New Orleans, La. She graduated with honors from Leon Godchaux High School in June 1929, and attended LSU on an academic scholarship, receiving her degree in 1933. She taught for several years at St. Aloysius Catholic School. Together, she and Earl Frenzel had four children: Earl Jr., Mary Jeanne, Michael Joseph and Helen Marie. Renée Jeanfreau Frenzel, a retired schoolteacher of Baton Rouge died December 1, 1998.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Mary Anne Hynes Frenzel was active in the administration and care of St. Joseph Cemetery, and materials related to that work are included in the collection.

Until 1819, the only cemetery associated with St. Joseph Cathedral was known as Our Lady of Sorrows Cemetery, which took its name from the original name of the parish, established in 1792 when Baton Rouge was still a Spanish colony. This original cemetery was behind the present Cathedral on land now covered by North Street, between Fourth and Fifth Streets. On June 9, 1819, George Garig donated a cemetery for parishioners in the southern portion of the parish, known as the Old Catholic Cemetery, and now known as the Highland Road Cemetery. By 1824, the original cemetery on North Street, which had been in operation since Baton Rouge's first days had become too small, and the Board of Trustees of the church began looking around for another burial ground. They purchased four arpents of ground for the new cemetery. A small corner was enclosed with fence rails, and several funerals had already taken place in the new burial ground. Thus 1824 is the date officially given as the beginning of St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery. The location, between North and Main Streets where it stands today, was a half mile outside the city limits of the time on what was known as the Comite Road. When it first opened, many families had relatives and ancestors buried in the old Spanish cemetery whose remains they removed to the new cemetery.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection of photographs, manuscripts and printed material documents the lives of Michael J. and Mary Anne Hynes Frenzel. Marriage, travel, family events, as well as Michael Frenzel's career as a pilot in the United States Air Force are illustrated primarily through photographic material. Community service and social activities, and the history of St. Joseph Cathedral and St. Joseph Cemetery are reflected in photographs, manuscripts and printed items. Photographs, printed material and manuscripts also provide a history of the allied Frenzel, Jeanfreau and Dielenschneider families.

Manuscripts in the collection consist of genealogical material, legal documents and correspondence. Photographic material is comprised of cabinet cards; portraits; group photographs; snapshots and slides. Images relate to family members, friends and associates of Michael and Mary Anne, in addition to Earl E. Frenzel's association with Exxon and Michael's military service. Military service images include several photographs and colored slides of Air Force planes and aerial views of undisclosed locations. Print items include yearbooks; ephemera; newspaper clippings; newsletters; published articles; bulletins; booklets and the book, *Luke Lea, of Tennessee* (1993).

Subgroup 1. Michael J. and Mary Anne Hynes Papers, 1808-2010, undated.

Series I. Personal Papers, 1808-2010, undated.

Subseries 1. St. Joseph Cathedral, circa 1915-2010, undated.

St. Joseph Cathedral papers are comprised of printed material and correspondence relating to the history of the Cathedral, with some items pertaining to the history of the Catholic Church in Baton Rouge. Printed items consist of booklets; articles; newspaper clippings; programs and bulletins. These include a dedication program (January 20, 1924); reprints of souvenir booklets issued by St. Joseph Cathedral (April 1953); a 200th anniversary calendar (1992) and parish directories (2000, 2010). The program, *Sesquicentennial Observance Founding of St. Joseph, Golden Sacerdotal Jubilee* (1943) and the booklet, *Saint Joseph Cathedral* ... (1987) provide the history of the Cathedral. The 1943 publication also includes short histories of local Catholic schools and pastors associated with the Church, while the 1987 publication contains a roster of parishioners. Bulletins reflect church activities (October 20, 2002, May-November 2006). A photocopy of the *History of the Catholic Church in Baton Rouge* (circa 1915) and the booklet, *The Catholic Church in Baton Rouge: A Chronicle* (1978) also provides the history of the local Catholic Church. An article entitled "Hallowed Halls" offers brief histories some south Louisiana Catholic churches (January 2010).

A photocopy of the history of the Cathedral's clock and steeple, which was added to the designs of F. B. Dicharry, is also found (1953). Information on the acquisition of the pipe organ for the Cathedral is found within correspondence and newsletters (1992-1993). An exchange of emails also discusses the origin of the Cathedral's stained glass windows (August 16, 2006). Additionally, papers contain a program for the Red Mass celebrated at the St. Louis Cathedral in New Orleans (October 6, 2008).

Subseries 2. St. Joseph Cemetery, 1808-2008, undated.

Early documents are comprised of photocopies relating to Philip Hickey of Hope Estate, south of Baton Rouge. They include the will of his father, Daniel Hickey (1808); a letter by P. Grymes (October 6, 1810) and a land conveyance signed by Philip Hickey transferring land to St. Joseph Church (September 15, 1825). There is also a diagram showing the cemetery in relation to property owned by Hickey (undated).

Papers include several undated histories, as well as related printed material. A typescript of a 1926 newspaper article announces the closure of the cemetery; with another article reporting on the effort to keep the cemetery open (April 27, 1926). A series of articles in the St. Joseph Church bulletin, *The Cry*, provides a history of the cemetery and its connection to Roselawn Memorial Park. The booklet, *Roselawn*, describes the new cemetery and its layout (circa 1926, photocopy); and an article in *Southern Cemetery* features Roselawn Memorial Park (1961: August-September). Additionally, papers include the rules and regulations for Roselawn Memorial Park (1971) and Greenoaks Memorial Park (1998). In her last year on the St. Joseph Cemetery Board, Mary Anne

initiated and chaired an All Saints Day celebration at the cemetery. Papers include correspondence, itinerary, expense list, and readings for the event (2002).

Subseries 3. Societies, Clubs, and Organizations, 1985-2010, undated.

This subseries contains papers reflecting the Frenzels participation in social and community events.

Baton Rouge Assembly file (1985-2007) consists of printed items related to members and Club activities. Material includes rosters and a silver jubilee booklet with the history of the Club and photographs of the debutantes who were presented from 1961-1985. Mary Anne (1962) and her sister, Juliette (1971) are among those presented. Rosters include debutantes for 2003, chairmen who served on the board from 1961-2002 (2003), and members for the year 2007.

Cancer Society of Greater Baton Rouge file (1990-1994) relates to the Capital Chefs' Showcase fundraising event sponsored by the Society. A list of the Society's Board of Directors is also included (June 9, 1994).

Harness Club file (2006) contains a member roster for 2006; invitations to social events; a newspaper photograph of club members and a short history of the Club written by Carol Anne Blitzer (undated).

La Fiesta Dance Club (2007-2008) membership directory includes lists of board members and past presidents, and the Club's charter.

Krewe of Bacchus (2002-2003) material pertains to the Mardi Gras Bacchus parade in New Orleans and related events sponsored by the Krewe of Bacchus in New Orleans. They include correspondence; receipts for membership dues; substitute riders submission forms and printed material relaying information on Mardi Gras events relating to Bacchus. Printed material also includes a tourist map showing the parade route (2002), and advertising brochures and flyers for Mardi Gras beads and souvenirs.

National Conference for Community Justice (1995-2000, undated) was originally known as the National Conference of Christians and Jews. The file consists of correspondence and printed material (1995-2000, undated). Correspondence discusses Mary Anne's membership on the Board of Directors of the Baton Rouge Region, and the organization's mission, research and programs. Correspondence also includes a letter announcing the organization's name change (November 1998). Printed material relays information on the NCCJ history, programs and events. Also found are annual reports (1998, 1999), newsletters and reprints of newspaper clippings (1998-2000). A copy of *The Color of Racism: Understanding & Overcoming Discrimination* (1995), inscribed by the author, Sam B. Pearson, to Mary Anne, is also included in this subseries.

The Woman's Club, Inc. (2009-2010) file contains the Club yearbook (2009/2010-2010/2011) and a welcome letter to members (September 10, 2010).

Subseries 4. Travel, 1962-2008, undated.

Travel papers consist of itineraries, correspondence and advertisements related to the numerous trips taken by Mary Anne and family members.

Subseries 5. Personal Papers, 1950-2009, undated.

Personal papers relate mostly to the social and community activities. They are comprised of correspondence, ephemera and newspapers, clippings and articles. Also found is Michael Frenzel's diploma from St. Agnes School (May 30, 1956) and a class reunion directory of former students (1997). Journals include an article on Luke Lea's attempt to kidnap Kaiser Wilhelm during World War I (January 1982), and another, appearing in *The Register*, a Baton Rouge society magazine, containing a photograph of the Hynes children, Mary Anne, Kenny and Joseph (August 12, 1950, p. 8). A third features the home of Elizabeth Gebelin Hynes (October 1976). Several newspapers articles provide information on the history of Baton Rouge and Louisiana (1997-2008).

Papers relating to friends include correspondence with the an American deaf actress Elizabeth Quinn, who was performing on the London stage (January-June 1982), a letter (March 10, 1990), personal notes, biographical sketch, and newspaper clippings on the career of composer, Professor Loris Chobanian (1989-1990). Genealogical material consists of photocopies of 19th and early 20th century family photographs (2009). The book, *Luke Lea, of Tennessee* (1993), a biography of Lea, illustrates his professional and political life. The Lea family is related to Mary Anne.

Series II. Photographs, 1943-2009, undated.

Subseries 1. Michael J. Frenzel Photographs, 1943-2002.

This subseries is comprised of snapshots, group photographs and portraits of Michael Frenzel from early childhood through adulthood, with the majority taken in his childhood. Photographs begin in 1943 at the age of eighteen months. They include early Christmases, class photographs through the eighth grade, and summers in Destrehan, La. Individual portraits and snapshots range from high school to his LSU graduation in 1965. Snapshots also include images of Michael, his mother Renée Jeanfreau Frenzel (circa 1998) and his twin sons, Patrick and Michael, at North American Top Gun aviation school (December 11, 1999). Additional photographs include his 60th birthday party (May 3, 2002).

Note: Additional photographs of Michael J. Frenzel are also found in Subseries 3. Michael J. Frenzel Family Photographs, Subseries 5. Travel Photographs, and Series IV. Digital Files, disc 2.

Subseries 2. Mary Anne Hynes Frenzel Photographs, 1943-2007, undated.

This subseries consists of photographs taken of Mary Anne Hynes Frenzel from her infancy into her adult life, depicting family gatherings and social events. Early photographs include Mary Anne on horseback at the Saddle Academy (1954) and with her Girl Scout troop at various locations including Camp Marydale, near St. Francisville La. School pictures include the Academy of the Sacred Heart at Grand Coteau, La. (1958), St. Agnes School, and her high school graduation picture from St. Joseph Academy (1961), as well as her graduation from Peabody College,

Nashville, Tenn. (1966). Later photographs show Mary Anne with siblings (1992), with friends at the St. Agnes School reunion (1997) and with her grandchildren (2003, 2007).

Note: Additional images of Mary Anne Hynes Frenzel are also found in Subseries 4. Michael J. Frenzel Family Photographs, Subseries 5. Travel Photographs and Series IV. Digital Files, disc 2.

Subseries 3. Michael J. Frenzel Family Photographs, 1966-2009, undated.

This group contains photographs of Michael and Mary Anne together with family members and friends at family functions and social events. Images include the wedding portraits of Mary Jeanne Frenzel (August 29, 1970) and Helen Frenzel (August 30, 1969), snapshots taken at the wedding of her daughter, Renée (1999) and son, Patrick (2005). A "Pudding Party" hosted by Mary Anne celebrates the birth of her first two grandchildren (May 2000). Social events are seen in photographs of parties, the Baton Rouge Assembly tea and (May 1987, May 1990) and ball 2002, 2003, the Bacchus Mardi Gras balls for 2002 and 2003, and the Harness Club (April 12, 1997, May 19, 2002). Photographs also include friends they met while Michael served in the Air Force (February 1998, April 1999, 2004).

Also found in this subseries are images of Wilma Coates taken with Frenzel and Hynes family members. Coates was employed as domestic help by the Hynes family for decades (1967, 1981, undated). In addition, there are photographs of "the farm" in Woodville, Miss. (2004, 2009), and a street scene in New Orleans with granddaughters, Maddie and Katie Becker (December 26, 2006).

Subseries 4. Travel Photographs, 1959-2002.

Travel photographs consist of snapshots and colored slides. They depict the Frenzels' travels to a number of locations around the globe including United States; England; Ireland; Greece; Russia; other locations in Europe; and Thailand. Historic sites include the Blarney Stone in Ireland (1967), Kenilworth Castle (1980), Big Ben (1980), and Lynch Lodge (circa 1999-2000) in England. Additionally, there are shots of English riders on horseback before a foxhunt (1980), and of Mrs. Hubbard who had helped Mary Ann with the twins when they young (circa 1999-2002). Photographs also depict Michael and Mary Anne on horseback in California (1994) and Alaska (1998).

Subseries 5. Church Related Photographs, 1966-2005, undated.

This subseries contains photographs of religious celebrations including the wedding and reception of Michael and Mary Anne. Photographs include images of Rev. Clifton Hill, Rev. Gerald Young and the St. Joseph Cemetery Board, of which Mary Anne was member for eight years.

Series III. Michael J. Frenzel Air Force Files, 1964-1985, 1991.

Air Force files are composed mostly of photographs and colored slides that chronicle Michael Frenzel's service in the United States Air Force, from pilot training school to his retirement. Non-photographic material consists of related newspapers clippings, published articles, ephemera, and correspondence that relate to the progress of his career. Also included are yearbooks from USAF Pilot Training in file Pilot Training-Laredo (1966) and Squadron Officers School in file AF Academy (circa 1973). Two files give a general overview of his military life beginning with pilot training through to retirement in 1985. His assignment locations include military bases in United

States, Thailand, Italy, Korea, and Alconbury, England. The files labeled Alconbury 2nd and Italy in December 1969 illustrate camp life, with photographs of tent camps and the men within. This series also contains several photographs of airplanes both in flight and on the ground, as well as aerial views of undisclosed locations (undated). Also found is a humorous notice of recognition for his 1st solo flight (January 29, 1966); a certificate of recognition awarded to Michael for his service during the Cold War (1991) and a photograph of Michael

Note: Files maintained in original order of the donor-- by service assignment, which is also largely chronological.

Series IV. Digital Files, circa 1930-2007 (files created 2007-2010).

Two computer discs comprise this series. Disc 1 titled "Hill - Edited Stories 10-05-201" contains short histories and descriptions of photographs created by Michael Frenzel about his early years and Air Force life; paper copies of these items are also located throughout the collection. Disc 2 "Hill-Second Installment 07-01-10" contains over 1100 digital files, which for the most part are scans of photographs reflecting family and social events, travels, as well as Michael's Air Force service. Digital scans of printed items and manuscripts are found, but to a much lesser extent. In most instances, the original or photocopy of the photographs or papers is found within the collection [see series and subseries]. Of particular interest are images, not found in the collection, that were taken while Michael was stationed overseas in England, Italy, and Southeast Asia. In addition, there are images of friends and social events also not found in the photographic series as prints. See Appendix A for a complete listing of files from disc 1 and a listing of files and folders of photographs, which do not appear elsewhere in the collection from disc 2.

Subgroup 2. Frenzel-Jeanfreau-Dielenschneider Family Papers, 1858-2010, undated.

Series I. Personal Papers, 1858-2010, undated.

This group contains correspondence; legal records; printed items; personal papers; genealogical notes (undated); and a genealogy chart of the allied Frenzel, Jeanfreau and Dielenschneider families (undated).

Personal papers relating to the Dielenschneider family consist of a French passport (October 5, 1858) and a letter issued by the City of New Orleans recognizing the marriage of Victor Dielenschneider to Mary Arsine Bayhi (February 23, 1864). Also, found are the birth records for Victor's children (1864-1889), as well as the birth/baptismal certificate for Donatile Olympia Dooley, daughter of Joseph Dooley and Floreska Rodrigue (April 7, 1888). Additionally, legal documents contain a receipt from the Office of Recorder of Births, Marriages and Deaths in Orleans Parish for the marriage registration of Alvey Jeanfreau and Honorine Dielenschneider (April 29, 1903) and a marriage license for Donatile Dooley and Edmond M. Frenzel (February 5, 1910). Papers contain the succession of Floreska Rodrigue (November 28, 1891) and the birth record for Renée Jeanne Jeanfreau, mother of Michael J. Frenzel, who was born January 14, 1912. A colored sketch depicts Jackson Square in New Orleans, with St. Louis Cathedral in the background (1914). Also present is a photocopy of the Notification of Birth Registration issued September 25, 1942 for Earl Edmond Frenzel, Sr., born November 3, 1910.

Correspondence relates to the initial contact made between Joseph Dielenschneider of Alsace, France, and the New Orleans branch of the Dielenschneider family (1925). Olga Jeanfreau papers reflect her scholastic achievements, membership in American Red Cross and the Louisiana Teachers Retirement System (1923-1937). Letters of Earl E. Frenzel discuss an assistantship in the Dept. of Chemical Engineering at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, Mass. (1934), a new design for hydraulic equipment (December 12, 1950), and a hydraulic levee grader (circa 1950).

Of particular interest is a contract between University Gardens, Inc., and Earl E. Frenzel, Sr., for a lot in University Gardens (1938). The agreement restricts African Americans from either occupying or acquiring the property, except in the capacity of an employee to a residing white family. Additionally, papers include a true copy (January 1, 1975) of Edmond M. Frenzel's death certificate issued July 29, 1963, and an unidentified land plat showing "the Large Plantation" on the "old road to Abbeville" (undated). Programs for the annual meetings of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem (1976, 1978) and relevant newspapers clippings (October 1976, September 1978) are also present. Other newspaper clippings report on the 50th reunion of Leon Godchaux High School class of 1923 (1973).

Series II. Photographs, circa 1880-2000. Subseries 1. Family Photographs, circa 1880-1997.

This series contains 19th and early 20th century cabinet cards, portraits, snapshots, and slides. The cabinet cards depict members of the Dielenschneider and Jeanfreau family, including Victor Dielenschneider (circa 1880); his daughter, Honorine; Alvey Jeanfreau and Amelia Richarme Jeanfreau. There is also a group photo of members of an organization referred to as C.W.A. (circa 1930-1939).

Snapshots show Renée Jeanfreau Frenzel and Earl E. Frenzel as young adults (1934-circa 1949), their wedding photos (June 1935), a Jeanfreau family reunion (1956) and Renée with her students at St. Aloysius Catholic School in Baton Rouge (1963-circa 1979). Snapshots also show Mary Jeanne Frenzel with family members at the Rosaryville in rural Tangipahoa Parish, La., where she was training for the Dominican Order (1958-1959). Photographs also show Olga Jeanfreau as a young woman (circa 1920-1929), as a teacher (1954-1955) and at a Leon Godchaux High School class reunion (1983).

This group contains portraits of Earl E. Frenzel, Renée Jeanfreau Frenzel and Olga Jeanfreau. In addition, there is a brief description and photographs of Albert P. Herget "Judge" who was a friend of Earl E. Frenzel (1975). Also found among the photographs are Earl E. and Renée Frenzel wearing the robes of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem (circa 1976 or circa 1978).

Subseries 2. Exxon Photographs, 1952-1974, 2000.

This group shows a barge on the Mississippi River containing gasoline (1952) and group photographs of Esso employees, including Earl E. Frenzel (1953-1955). The largest part of this subseries shows work crews lowering a section of a pipeline bundle into the Mississippi River in

preparation for Hurricane Carmen (1974). Additional material includes a memo relating to the Waterborne Crude Project (July 11, 1974), *The Baton Rouge Record*, an Exxon publication (October 4, 1974, December 5, 1975), and one issue of *The Red Stick* (October 2000).
